

INDIA @ 100 Launched by Spire World

A culmination of an International Competition Jury Process

“India @100” is being launched with a firm conviction that Indian cities are the theatre where the drama of the nation will be enacted. India’s urban population of 300 Mn is poised to double over the next two decades to 600 Mn. Will this shift change the nature and identity of India and the idea of being ‘Indian’? Will cities emerge as alternate vote banks? The opportunity to influence this realm has never been as important as it is now.

This initiative is promoted and supported by Spire World, the development arm of Millennium Spire, established in 2005 as an India focused Real Estate and Infrastructure Investment fund with a view to help promote development projects that are in the mainstream of India’s rapid urbanization.

A week long Festival of Urbanity is being planned at the India Habitat Centre from 6th April to 14th April, 2011. The festival will host exhibitions, lectures, seminars and citizen participatory events.

Spire World also organized an International Design Competition for its next flagship complex proposals for a 62,750 sq.mt mixed use development at Greater Noida. 713 architects from 68 countries submitted 201 entries.

Jaya Jaitly, also anchored the discussion in which sustainable models of transformation, cultural directions, new policy for a new generation, and infrastructure were deliberated.

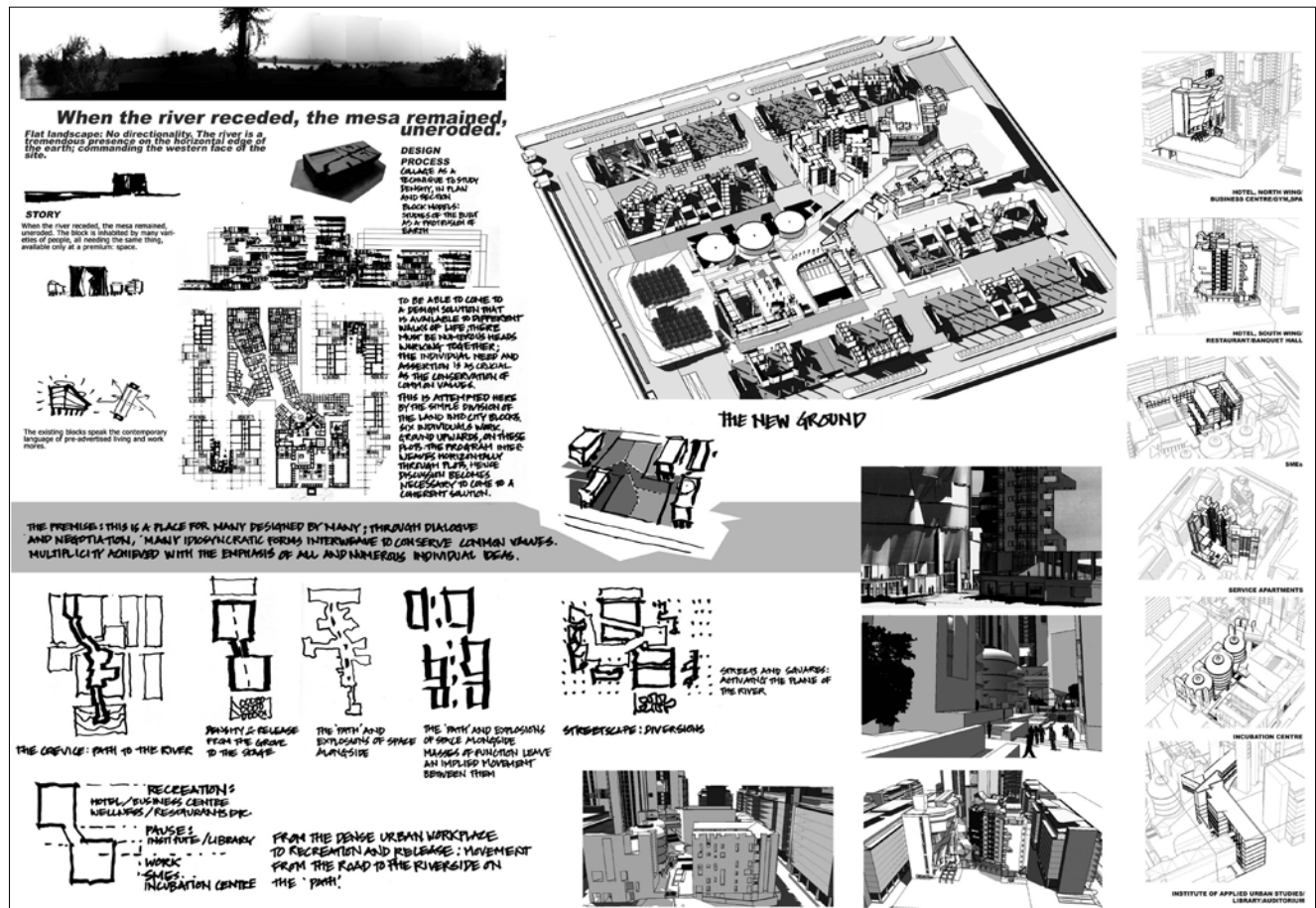

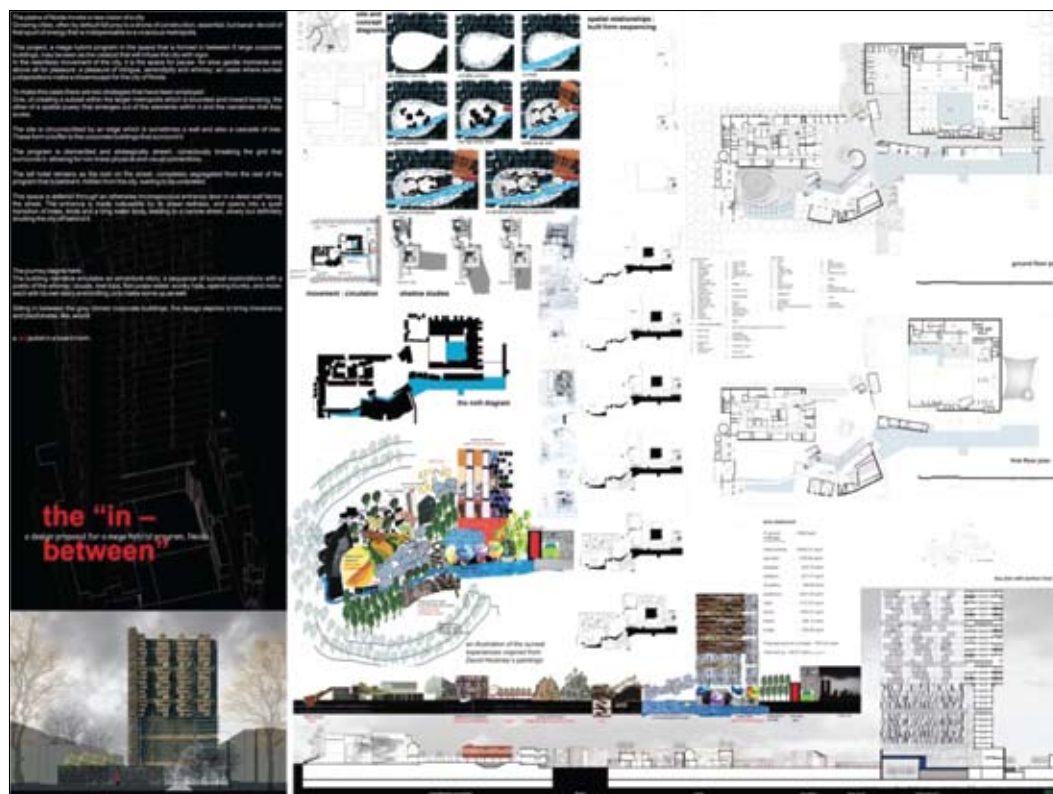

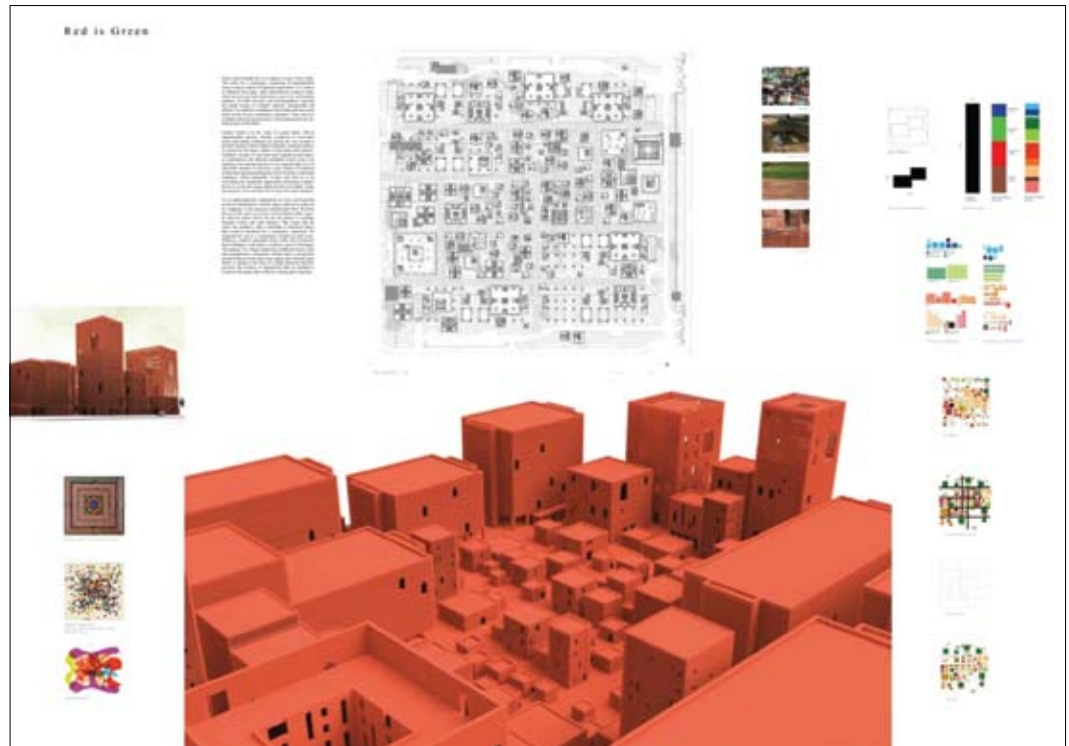
